Dear Dr Blackthorne,

Thank you for accepting Marjorie Jackson, a 40-year-old female, into your hospital. She has been diagnosed with depressive psychosis and warrants an urgent assessment and admission in your hospital.

Three months ago, Marjorie presented into our practice with the complaints of insomnia, fatigue and weight loss following the death of her older sister. Despite having no abnormalities on examining her, she seemed tearful and depressed. As a result, a diagnosis of reactive depression was made and bereavement counselling with social worker was planned.

One month later, Marjorie had no improvement in her symptoms despite attending counselling sessions regularly. In addition, she was hesitant on engaging in daily activities along with being socially withdrawn as per her relatives. Subsequently, Doxepin was prescribed to be taken

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at a dose of 25mg ~~in b nocte~~ nocte increasing to 100mg nocte over the next 10 days. She was also advised to continue her counselling sessions.

Today, Marjorie was accompanied by her family and they noticed her being socially withdrawn, refusing food and not being compliant with her medication. She was also noticed having self-talk which was not in accordance to time and place. Over the past 3 months, she had a weight loss of over 6 kgs.

Marjorie was diagnosed with post-natal depression and her mother has a history of depression.

In light of above, I would be grateful if you could assess and arrange an urgent admission in your hospital.
