Ms. Emma presented first to my clinic on 30/11/2009, when she had nocturnal cough lasting ~~for~~ two weeks with runny nose and mild fever. She was slightly flushed and had red pharynx on examination. A peak expiratory flow rate (PEFR) of 250 L/min was recorded. This led to a diagnosis of respiratory infection with possible associated asthma. She was prescribed Paracetamol, fluids and advised to review if condition worsens.

In the next visit dated 21/12/09, Ms. Emma had unresolved symptoms except for fever. A faint basal wheeze was noted and PEFR of 230 L/min was recorded. Ventolin puffs twice for three times a day was prescribed for probable Asthma. There was improvement in her next visit but asthma was still unstable. For this, Becotide 200 two puffs for three times a day was initiated and called for review after 4 weeks.

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Her condition improved on 8/02/10 and ^{she} was advised current therapy and review in 2 months. Today, She presented with symptoms suggestive of Severe asthma possibly triggered by infection for which ventolin nebuliser station was administered.
